LBA President, Robert Kallam, who has made highlighting LBA Members' community service one of the primary aims of his term. As Robert likes to say, the community understands what we do for our clients inside the courtroom and conference room, but the community needs to know what we do for our neighbors in schools and churches, on boards and commissions, and in support of so many important charitable causes.

Rule 6.1 of the Rules of Professional Conduct establishes that "[e]very lawyer should aspire to provide legal services to those unable to pay," and that "[a] lawyer should aspire to render at least fifty hours of pro bono publico legal services per year." According to Rule 1.6, a substantial majority of the fifty hours should be rendered through the direct provision of pro bono legal services to persons of limited means or the provision of pro bono legal services to charitable, religious, civic, community, governmental and educational organizations in matters that are designed primarily to address the needs of persons of limited means. But lawyers may also satisfy the aspirational goal by delivering legal

services at no fee or substantially reduced fee to individuals, groups or organizations seeking to secure or protect civil rights, civil liberties or public rights, or charitable, religious, civic, community, governmental and educational organizations, as well as participating in activities for improving the law, legal system or the legal profes-The number of lawyers who sion. more than satisfy the aspirational goal set forth in Rule 1.6 is impressive and it's a story that needs to be told, especially considering the attitude of some in society toward the legal profession.

Many of you have already responded to surveys and requests for information about what you and your colleagues do in the community. If you have not responded, please reach out and let us know about your community service. If you are inspired by the service of someone else in the legal profession, let us know! (We will not publicize anything about you or anyone else without consent. We respect that many people do not want recognition for their efforts. But we still want to know!)

Lawyers should have thick skins and should be able to take a ribbing. Sometimes, we even deserve to be the butt of a joke. But we should also make sure that the public understands who we really are, what we really do, and how invested we really are in our communities. This is essential not because we need or deserve the adulation, but because trust in the legal profession is absolutely necessary to the proper functioning of our justice system.

The Louisiana State Bar Association (LSBA) held its 38th annual Pro Bono Publico & Children's Law Awards Ceremony was held on May 17, 2023, at the Louisiana Supreme Court in New Orleans. Louisiana's seven Supreme Court Justices presided over the ceremony in an official court session to demonstrate their fervent support for pro bono and the efforts of the volunteers being honored.

Pro bono service is essential to ensuring that all people can access justice in Louisiana, where the number of people eligible for free legal services outnumbers legal aid attorneys by an enormous 11,250 to one. CRIMINAL LAW SECTION A MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT CHASE MANUEL

Given the ongoing trend of states toward the legalization and decriminalization of marijuana, it is important to consider whether the doctrine of plain smell requires additional inquiry by law enforcement in order to establish probable cause to search. The Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution protects individuals from unreasonable searches and seizures by the government, with an exception known as probable cause, which allows law enforcement officials to search a person or their property when there is a reasonable belief of finding evidence of criminal activity.

During a traffic stop, the odor of marijuana emanating from a vehicle has traditionally been used as a factor in establishing probable cause to search. However, in light of recent changes in marijuana laws, the mere presence of marijuana odor, alone, may no longer automatically establish probable cause to search a vehicle, especially when the individual in question may possess a valid medical marijuana prescription, as is the case in Louisiana. Unlike in previous years, where the odor of raw or burnt marijuana alone would suffice for law enforcement to search, it is now likely that law enforcement officials have a duty to further question the driver when they detect the odor of marijuana coming from a vehicle. Specifically, it may now behoove law enforcement to first inquire whether a driver or passenger possess a valid medical marijuana prescription.

When a suspect indicates that they have a valid medical marijuana prescription, law enforcement officials must consider this information when determining whether probable cause exists to search the vehicle. In the absence of additional evidence suggesting that the individual is using marijuana for illegal purposes. the presence of a valid prescription should be sufficient to dispel the suspicion of criminal activity and negate the establishment of probable cause. Moreover, a failure of law enforcement to now make such an inquiry may breach their duty to ensure that probable cause is properly established before conducting a search. Consequently, this failure may render any subsequent search unconstitutional and could result in the suppression of possible evidence related to a more serious offense.
